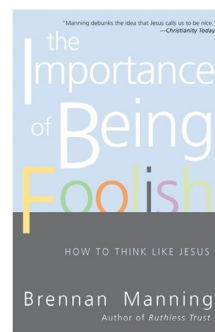


The Immoral Majority

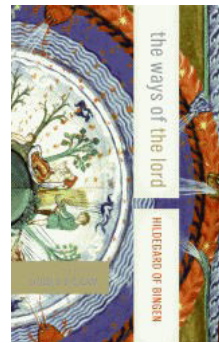
Meister Eckhart

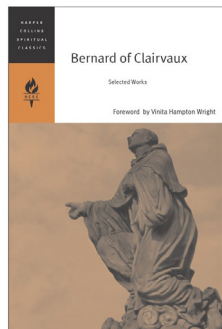


The Ways of the Lord

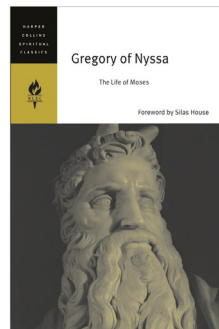
Bernard of Clairvaux

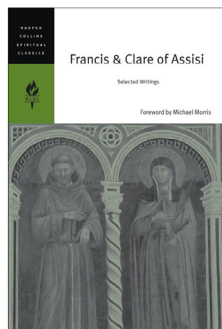
Gregory of Nyssa

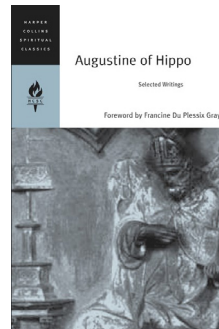


Francis & Clare of Assisi

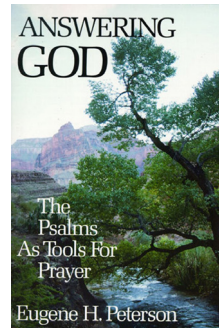

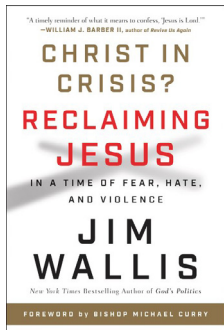
Athanasius

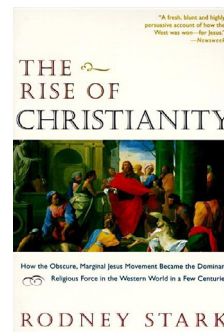


Christ in Crisis?
